

Seaman's Body Found In River After 2 Months

Point Pleasant, W. Va., April 16 (AP) — The body of a Coast Guard seaman who drowned in the Kanawha River near here has been recovered more than two months after his death, U. S. Coast Guard officials said last night.

Boatswain J. J. Scoffier, officer in charge of the Coast Guard station at near-by Lock 11, said the body of Paul C. Kistner, 28, of Earlington, Hopkins County, Ky., was seen floating in the river yesterday by three Henderson, W. Va., residents.

Kistner and seaman Chester A. Meyers, about 22, of Peebles, Ohio, drowned when a small dinghy they were riding in capsized in the river February 4. The Coast Guard recovered Meyers' body while dragging the river that night. Continued efforts to locate Kistner failed.
