Russell Colbeth, aged 19, a surfaman and for a time he feared that he could not make the shore. The surf was running libels and once when he got his feet on the shore the undertow caught him and pulled him back, fle looked back and found that Colbeth was coining along. Soon after he heard Colbeth calling to ribe dory, from the station,

Apparently his voice did, not entry and Hunkins began calling. The crew heard him and two men Jumped Into the dary and started for Colbeth, As they neared blin one of the men threw him a life preserver and it fell near him, but Colbeth suddenly sunk and he was not seen again. One of the surf men dove over where Colboth disappeared, but he fulled to reach libra-They rowed around and frequently dove but the water, was all riled up and the surfacen said they could not see under water.
