

Harold Benjamin Irsh To Have Name Placed In Arlington Cemetery

Harold Benjamin Irsh, son of Mrs. Mary B. Irsh of 275 Albany Avenue, who lost his life while serving in the United States Coast Guard during the World War, will soon have his name inscribed in the Arlington National Cemetery, Washington, D. C.

He was a stoker on the coast guard ship, Tampa, and was drowned when the craft was torpedoed in the Britesh Channell and went down with all hands aboard, September 26, 1918.

Before his enlistment, Irsh worked as a machinist in the Terry Turbine Company of this city. He was born in Buckland where he spent most of his life, moving to Hartford about a year before he joined the Coast Guard. He left, besides his parents, a sister, Mrs. Lester Dewey of this city.
